

5.2 The shipowner

It is the responsibility of the shipowner of the ship on which stowaways are found:

.3 to cover any applicable costs relating to the removal, detention, care and disembarkation of the stowaway in accordance with the legislation of the States which may be involved.



## **2-1) SOLAS**

**SOLAS**: Chapter V, Regulation 29

1. The master of a ship at sea which is in a position to be able to provide assistance <u>on receiving a signal from any source that persons are in distress at sea</u>, is bound to proceed with all speed to their assistance, if possible informing them or the search and rescue service that the ship is doing so. (the rest omitted)

## **2-1) SOLAS**

### **Predictable Consequences**

#### Before

- It has not a specific explanation for the rescue target.
- There is no firm guarantee for special cases such as maritime refugees.

#### After

SOLAS can emphasize that any situation should be treated non-discriminatory.

## 2-2) SAR's Annex (2)

### **Predictable Consequences**


#### Before

- The parties have avoided unloading rescuers in into safe land.
   Moreover, the party states have only taken temporary measures.
- Death rate of maritime refugees was high.

#### After

- Adequate procedures can be taken after landing regardless of the nationality, status of such a person.
- **Death rate** of refugees can be **reduced**.





- Giving the opportunity to be properly treated after rescue to everyone.
- It will help solve the problem of the maritime refugee.

- It will prevent ships from drifting and causing huge financial losses because of refugee shutdown.
- Rapid rescue and disembarkation after rescue will also *help facilitate maritime transportation*.
